Disasters (Typhoons and Earthquakes)

Japan is a country prone to disasters such as typhoons (lots of rain and strong winds) and earthquakes.

~When a disaster occurs~ Cellular phone lines will have difficulty connecting. Electricity, gas, and water may stop. Trains and buses may stop and roads may become impassable.



5Preparations before a disaster occurs

- Check the evacuation shelter (Hinanjyo) you can escape to in the event of an earthquake or typhoon.
- Participate in disaster prevention training (practice in case of a disaster).
- Prepare a stockpile of food, water, a flashlight, etc. for three days to a week so that you will not be in trouble if electricity, gas, or water is cut off.
- Prepare items to take with you in the event of an evacuation (food, water, medicine, important items, etc.).
