When you become pregnant, you will receive a "Maternal and Child Health Handbook" at the City Hall.

If you have any concerns or problems, you can ask for advice.

■Maternal and Child Health Handbook

Take it with you when you go to the hospital.

It should contain information such as the mother's health condition during pregnancy, the size of the newborn baby's body, what illnesses the baby has had, and any vaccines (injections to prevent illnesses) and other information.

When you receive your maternal and child health handbook, you will also get a book of tickets to have Pregnancy Health Checkup.

Children under 6 years old, before attending elementary school, can attend daycare nurseries, kindergartens, and a certified children's institution (Nintei Kodomo-en).

Shiritu-Nintei- Kodomo-en (Private certified children's institution)	 It combines the features of both a kindergarten and a day nursery. If you want your child to attend, you apply around October of the previous year. 		

*There is no charge for childcare in the 3-to 5-years-old class. Please contact the facility directly for the cost of educational materials, and others.



- Parents of children between the ages of 6 and 15 are required to go to school in Japan. (Compulsory education)
- From the age of 6, children attend elementary school, and from the age of 12 to 15, junior high school.
- The school year begins in April and ends in March of the following year.
 - Foreign children can also attend elementary and junior high schools in Japan. (Please apply at the City Hall.)
- The school you attend is determined by where you live (your address).

Entrance Orientation (Nyugaku- Setsumeikai)	•Children who will be entering the first grade of elementary school in April will have an orientation session around November at the elementary school where they will be entering. •Children who will be entering their first year of junior high school in April will have an orientation meeting at the junior high school they will enter around November to January.	
Fee	 Tuition, textbooks, and meals are free of charge. There is a fee for studying materials. If your income is too low to pay the fee, you may be able to receive school financial assistance. (Shugaku-enjyo) 	
Japanese language study (Early Adaptation Class)	In cases where a foreign student is attending a Japanese school for the first time and does not speak or understand Japanese at all, we will provide a 3-months course of study of Japanese language, etc.	
Career guidance	There will be an information session about high school life for foreign students and guardians. (Around September)	

■High School(Koko)

A person who has graduated from a junior high school (a person who has not graduated from a junior high school in Japan but is recognized as having the same level of academic ability) may take an entrance examination and be admitted to a high school. If they pass the entrance examination, they are eligible to attend the school.

There are also "regular" high schools, which students attend at night, and "correspondence" high schools, where students study via the Internet.



■University, Junior College, Vocational School

High school graduates may take an examination to enroll in a university, short-term college (junior college), or vocational school. If you pass the exam, you can attend the school. Please ask directly to the school you want to go to.

■After-school children's clubs

When parents are unable to take care of their children after elementary school classes are over due to work or other commitments, they can leave their children in the care of an after-school children's club.
