In Japan, you must have health insurance in case of injury or illness.

Kokumin-Kenko-Hoken (National Health Insurance) Employees of a company are covered by the company's health insurance (social insurance).

Those who do not have social insurance are enrolled in Iga City's National Health Insurance.

Koki-Koreisha-Iryo-Seido (Late-Stage Medical Care System for the Elderly) When you turn 75 years old, you will be enrolled in the "Late-Stage Medical Care System for the Elderly.

You will discontinue your previous health insurance.

In addition

- If the amount of money you pay to a hospital exceeds the amount determined, a portion of the money will be returned to you. (*Kogaku-Iryohi:* High-cost medical care expenses)
- Money received when a child is born (*Shussan-Ikuji-Ichijikin:* Lump-sum childbirth allowance) and money received when an insured person dies (*Sosaihi*, Funeral expenses) are also available.

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In Japan, everyone between the ages of 20 and 59 is enrolled in the National Pension Plan. Those who have paid into the pension plan will receive money when they grow old or are unable to work due to illness, injury or disability.

- For those who work for a company \Rightarrow *Kosei-nenkin* (Company pension)
- For those who don't work for a company \Rightarrow *Kokumin-nenkin* (National Pension)

All residents of Japan over the age of 40 are covered by nursing care insurance. After you pay a nursing care insurance premium, you can access the services you need by only paying a portion of the cost when you become bedridden or need long-term care. If you wish to use nursing care services, you must apply to the city for certification that you need nursing care.
